## New Members Co-ordinator's Report AGM 2017

The 2016/17 financial year has been exceptionally busy for Canine Friends in the new members area with 195 new members for the period. This doesn't include the many applications that are received and either withdrawn, or the dog and/or owner doesn't pass our assessment, or the dog is simply too young.

I assumed the New Co-ordinator role late last year and with the switch to our Member Management System (Wild Apricot) accessing the statistics for the entire year was not possible with any degree of accuracy. However, at 31 March 2017:

- There were 195 new members throughout New Zealand, with the largest number in Auckland with a total of 48 new members. Well done Rachel and Kim.
- Dunedin which had been dormant for several years resumed operation and there were 2 new members and 2 being processed. Thanks to Beth.
- There was a $52 \%$ increase on successful applications than the previous year. Up from 128.
- Our members continue to come from all walks of life, from students to retirees, with a myriad of occupations.
- Applications continue to come from all over New Zealand. We have relied on the nearest Liaison Officer in distance to assess members. Judy in Hamilton assessed a member from the Coromandel.
- There were 65 applications in various stages of processing (many now completed and more being received).
- At the rate that we are receiving new applications (around 40 per month based on the last 5 months), we would expect to have up to 300 new members this time next year.

The following table shows the distribution of applicants and workload. Please note that applicants rejected or withdrawn are not included.
