President: Vicky Graham

My involvement with Canine Friends Pet Therapy began in the early 1990's as a volunteer and committee member. With much pride, I have witnessed the growth of our organisation from its small beginnings in Wellington to a recognised and respected nationwide charity.

My professional career spanned 25 years in the insurance industry, the last 10 in senior management roles.
