Welcome

Our President Vicky Graham welcomed everyone to our third online Annual General Meeting of Canine Friends Pet Therapy and she acknowledged the apologies that had been received.

Tribute to our Founder Eileen Curry:

Eileen passed away peacefully on 25 April ten days after her 96th birthday. She resided at Aroha Rest Home in Lower Hutt and sadly due to Covid was unable to celebrate her birthday with family and friends. In true fashion she didn't complain and looked forward to seeing them once Aroha was out of lockdown. This wasn't meant to be.

I recall saying to her some time ago she wasn't "allowed" to leave us during "my watch" but those of you who knew her personally would agree that she didn't always do as she was told!

Eileen established Canine Friends Pet Therapy with a group of like-minded friends in 1990. She was working with the SPCA when she witnessed a distressing incident that was the catalyst for Canine Friends. An elderly woman was going into care and could not take her beloved dog with her, nor had any family to take her dog. Eileen was very moved at witnessing the owner's despair at parting with her dog that she offered to visit this woman with one of her own Golden Retrievers. She quickly realised this could be a service that would bring comfort to many people... especially the elderly and those who feel isolated, stressed, and afraid.

Several years later Eileen was awarded a Hutt City Council Civic Award for her service to the community.

In a booklet titled "Canine Friends Pet Therapy – The First Ten Years... or so" produced by two of Eileen's grandchildren a paragraph reads:

"Watching Eileen work the room of a local retirement home with her dog Flare, it is difficult to imagine she is at least as old as many of the people she is visiting."

Eileen's reply was "Mentally I don't feel that old. I look at them and I see that they are elderly, but I don't see it in myself."

Not allowing age to be a barrier, she continued to visit into her eighties.

She was extremely proud of Canine Friends and has left a wonderful legacy – one which we will honour.

Finally, two of many tributes I received following Eileen's death:

"When I leave this world, I hope to leave it better than I found it, leave a rainbow of lasting memories, have helped at least one person's life, well done Eileen, you achieved it all."

And "She must have been an institution on her own starting this initiative at the age of 64".



And from all of us here – may you now walk freely with your beloved Golden Retrievers, Cairn Terriers and the Canine Friends dogs who have left us.
